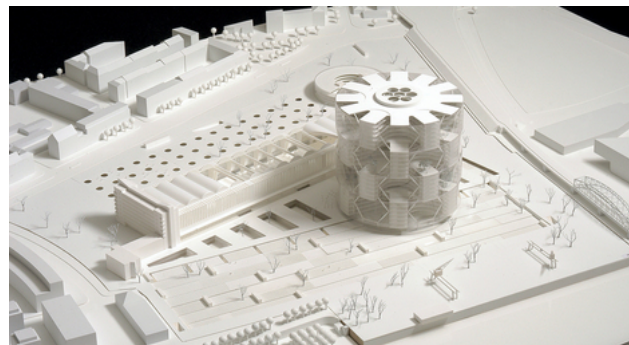
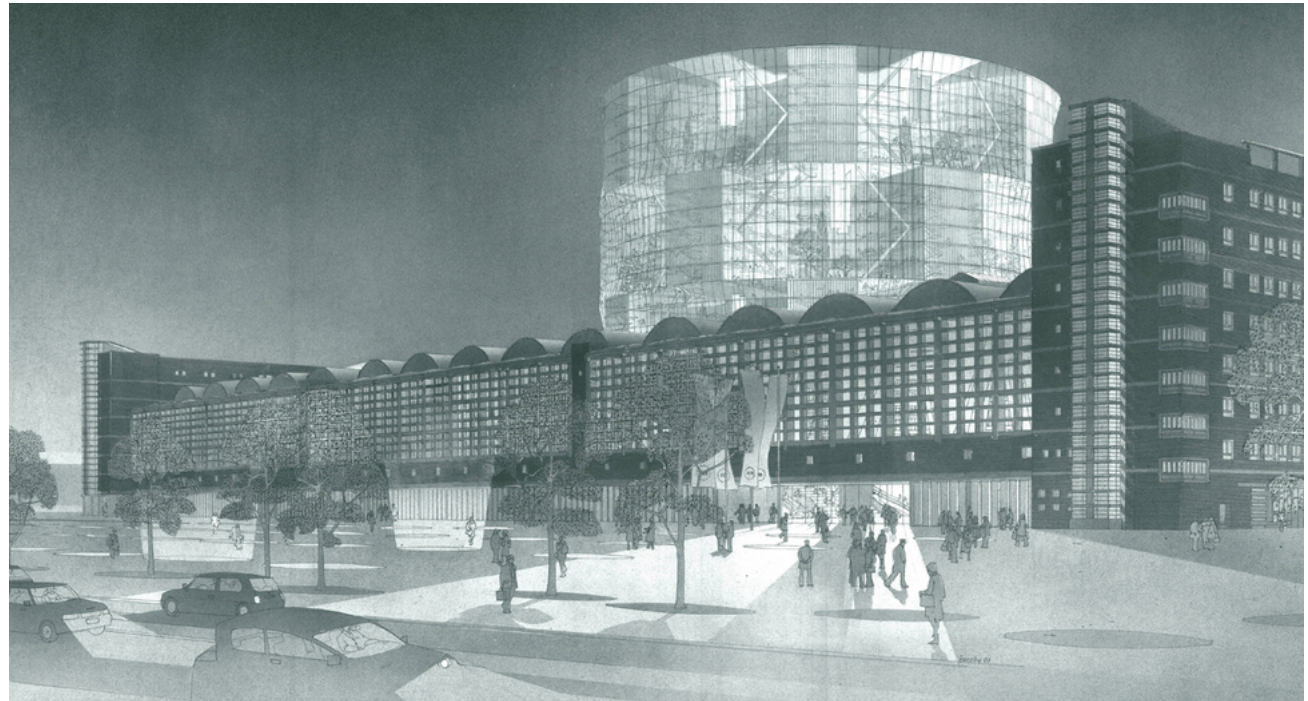

All the necessary rooms are housed within a centralized structure, like a town stacked vertically. As a counterpoint to the covered wholesale market, a compact, 89 m diameter circular building has been placed between the historical building and the Main River.

Grouped into four units, each being six stories tall, three semicircular office tracts dock onto a central core on each floor. As with a cogwheel, these units are staggered by half a turn, so that each unit's ceiling forms the platform for a "sky garden" above. This new methodology combines the advantages of cogged structures - good views, natural ventilation and small units - with the advantage of the tower - short distances and central access.

A generous and compact building has been planned; both simple and complex, rational and poetic, modern and timeless.
